Biological Opinion on the NFIP in Oregon

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) recently issued a biological opinion on the impacts of implementing the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) on endangered and threatened marine animals in Oregon. The “Oregon BiOp” is the final document from a multi-year Endangered Species Act consultation between FEMA and NMFS. The document contains a Reasonable and Prudent Alternative (RPA) with recommended changes to the way that FEMA, the State of Oregon, and local governments administer the NFIP in Oregon.

FEMA Region X is working with Oregon Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD) and other stakeholders to develop and provide information, training, and technical assistance to local governments in Oregon for the implementation of changes to the way that the NFIP is administered as a result of the BiOp and RPA. Webinars will be hosted by DLCDC in May and a series of workshops will be offered at locations across Oregon in June and July concerning the Oregon BiOp and the RPA. Specific dates and times will be announced by DLCDC (www.oregon.gov/LCD).

Workgroups will be formed to examine the BiOp and RPA, and advise DLCDC on a path forward toward implementation.

- Elimination of subsidies for certain Pre-FIRM properties with policies that lapse and are reinstated
- Further guidance for determining building occupancy
- Revised definition for business buildings
- Additional instructions for Pre-FIRM buildings that were substantially improved on or after April 1, 2015

If you are a CRS community using the Region X Elevation Certificate Review ([ECQC](#)) [Tool](#) in your floodplain development review process, you should *also* use the [CRS EC Checklist](#) to ensure that the information provided on the Elevation Certificate meets the requirements for CRS Activity 310. The ECQC Tool cannot verify the community name and ID, for example, or other potential errors

BIA Climate Change Funding

The Department of the Interior (DOI), Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) Tribal Climate Resilience Program (TCRP) is pleased to announce the FY16 Climate Funding Opportunity to support tribal projects to address:

- climate change adaptation (planning, workshops, and travel support),
- ocean and coastal management planning (and travel support),
- capacity building (new!),
- and to provide youth internships (research, management, or youth engagement).

In Fiscal Year 2016, a new Category 9, "Capacity Building", has been

created to support tribes that have limited technical or staffing capacity to identify how the tribe or tribal organization can start addressing climate change adaptation.

Contract proposals must contain the information required by 25 CFR 900.8 and all proposals must have tribal resolution(s) supporting their requests in order to receive funding.
