

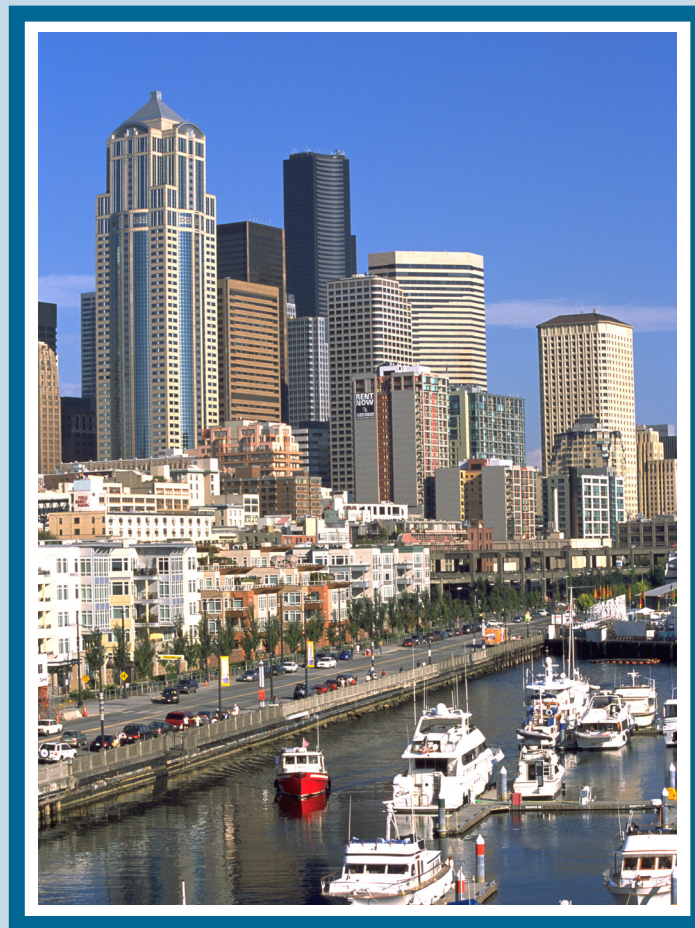

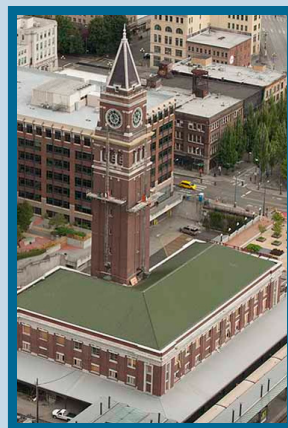

• **Preserving and Protecting Historic Buildings in Seattle:** a walking tour of earthquake retrofit and rehabilitation projects in the historic Pioneer Square district of Seattle.

• **Innovations in Earthquake Engineering:** Visit two University of Washington facilities: the Pacific Northwest Seismic Network and the Structural Research Laboratory.
